

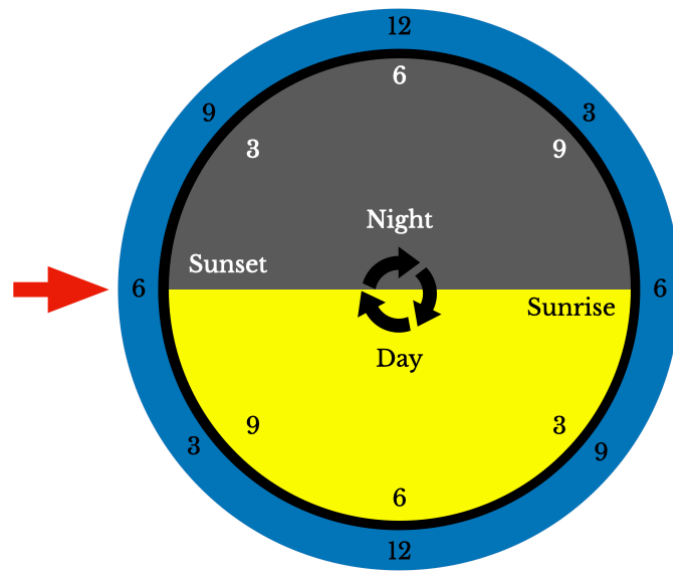
Reconning of Day's and Time of Day

Modern Day Reconning

24 hour day, new day begins at midnight, sunrise and sunset happen at different “times” every day, times expressed as AM/PM or in 24 hour format.

Hebrew Day Reconning

Variable number of hours in a day, new day begins at sunset, sunrise and sunset are the anchoring features of each day, times expressed in number of hours since sunset/sunrise.



Hebrew Weeks

Each week is patterned from the creation week in Genesis and include 6 days where working is permissible and the seventh day is to be a day of rest (sabbath). Because each new day begins at sunset, the weekly sabbath day begins in the evening after the 6th day, so work can be done up until sunset. The weekly sabbath was set aside as a day of rest and worship.

Special Sabbath Observances

In addition to the regular weekly sabbath, there were other special sabbath days connected to the various feasts throughout the Hebrew calendar. For instance, the Passover feasts is considered a High Holy Sabbath regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. It is connected to the feast of Unleavened Bread which is a 7 day feast that starts on Passover and runs for 7 straight days, but only the first and last day of the feast are considered High Holy Sabbath days. One could work on the other days that did not fall on a regular weekly sabbath.

The Hebrew Calendar & The Feasts of the LORD

14 And God said, “Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and years, **15** and let them be lights in the expanse of the heavens to give light upon the earth.” And it was so. **16** And God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. **17** And God set them in the expanse of the heavens to give light on the earth, **18** to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness.
